Microsoft (MS 1) has a new, free service called Live Mesh. It allows you to share folders and files, synchronize folders and files, and connect to a remote PC. Live Mesh is available at (2). This is a beta that has been available for a year. The reviews I have looked at have few complaints. Many complaints have been fixed with updates. This product is free, but I do not know if it will remain free once it is released. MS supplies the user with 5 GB of storage (on their servers).

MS is offering the Windows 7 RC (release candidate 1). After many fits and starts (1) MS has set a hard date for the release of Windows 7. It will be available on October 22nd of this year (2). VERY IMPORTANT - If you purchase a regular computer or laptop (not a netbook or CULV (3)) between now and 10/22/09, be certain that you get an upgrade to Windows 7 certificate or else you will be stuck with Vista. If you are brave and have a spare PC that can handle Windows 7 (4), you can download a limited use copy here (5). BTW the Windows 7 Upgrade Advisor is on the CD or the Month for July.

Windows 7 upgrade is available at (1) as a pre-order. The site reads, "Windows 7 was built around your feedback, so you'll see a lot of things you've asked for. You asked us to make everyday tasks faster and easier, to make your PC work the way you want it to, and to make it possible to do new things. And that's exactly what we've done." It fails to mention that the feedback was generated by the poor quality of Vista and that the XP product feature set has returned including an "XP mode". Very little has been upgraded except the look of XP. The upgrades are Home Premium, Professional, and Ultimate. These were offered at a significant discount for about 2 weeks in June but are now priced at the \$120 to \$220 range. The announcement of discounts was a side bar in some of the trade publications. I did not see any release of the information aimed at consumers. Thanks MS. The recommendation for installation of the upgrades is to wipe the hard drive and do a fresh install which means that these upgrades are actually full products that may require entry of the key from a previous product. Wiping the hard drive, reinstalling all the software, and getting all the settings back to preference is a day long project for me. Thanks MS.

A telling PBS (3) Frontline (4) documentary shows how the electronic waste stream flows from the United States to Ghana, China, Hong Kong, Viet Nam, and / or India (5). All the countries except India have no controls of the waste which becomes environmentally deleterious. India has at least one company that tries to actually recycle. The company is lobbying the Indian government to force compliance, thus, if implemented, makes the company very rich. One thing to note is that at the 6th minute of the video (5), hard drives are discussed. The video shows that unless hard drives are scrubbed or physically destroyed they retain data that can be gleaned by recycle personnel and used to steal identities or other illegal activities.

The Economist (2) recently had a story (3) about a quantum discovery. 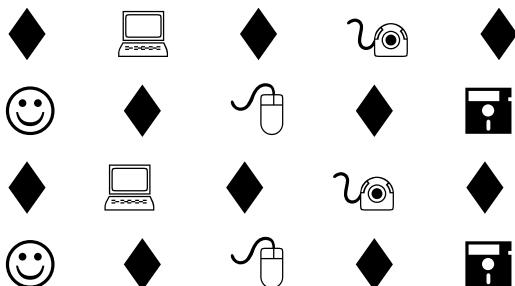
