The brown bear cams are all turned off for the season. With longer night time hours, now is the time to keep the Aurora cam sites in your favorites. The Northern Lights (Aurora Borealis) cam at Churchill, Manitoba, Canada (1) is in the Central Time zone as is the polar bear site (2). If you stay up really late or get up early, try the Alaska Borealis cams (3). Two places to try offer various cams from around the world

(4, 5). To check on the space weather (for aurora forecasts) try here (6) and NASA (7).

23 and Me (1) is the company that you allow to check your DNA. From the

report you get detailed genetic ancestry and some health data. Their web site states that you can remove the information when you cancel your account. Well, since last year when they were hacked and lost 14,000 records, of the 14 million they were holding, the resulting lawsuit revealed that by law the company could not let customers remove all their information. Here is the applicable part of the privacy policy:

"23andMe and/or our contracted genotyping laboratory will retain your Genetic Information, date of birth, and sex as required for compliance with applicable legal obligations, including the federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (CLIA), California Business and Professions Code Section 1265 and College of American Pathologists (CAP) accreditation requirements, even if you chose to delete your account. 23andMe will also retain limited information related to your account and data deletion request, including but not limited to, your email address, account deletion request identifier, communications related to inquiries or complaints and legal agreements for a limited period of time as required by law, contractual obligations, and/or as necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims and for audit and compliance purposes."

If you have used 23 and Me, you can remove some of your information but as you can see they will retain quite a bit that can be hacked. The company lost the law suit. The CEO, Anne Wojcicki (2), is taking the company private. She will need some investors and a good IT security staff to restore confidence in the company. There are competitors including; Nebula Genomics (3), LivingDNA (4), MyHeritage (5), AncestryDNA (6). All these products are expensive, as is 23 and Me. I suspect they all have similar privacy policies so beware.

# Audacity Software Review A Audio Recording and Editing Software by John Spizzirri

Audacity is versatile audio recording and editing software that is free to use on Windows and other operating systems. Begin using Audacity by downloading and installing it from its website ( 1 ). Once installed, start it to open a new project.

### The Audacity interface consists of several key elements

Menu Bar:

Contains various options for file management, editing, effects, and more.

Tool Bar:

Provides quick access to commonly used tools like selection, zoom, and envelope.

Control Bar:

Houses playback controls, recording options, and audio device settings.

Track Panel:

Displays your audio tracks and allows for track-specific adjustments.

Timeline:

Shows the duration of your project and allows for precise editing.

## **Recording Audio**

Set up your microphone:

Connect your microphone to your computer.

In Audacity, click the dropdown menu next to the microphone icon in the Control Bar.

Select your microphone from the list of input devices.

Adjust recording levels:

Speak into your microphone and watch the input level meter.

Adjust the input volume slider so the meter peaks around -12 dB to -6 dB.

Start recording:

Click the red Record button in the Control Bar or press R on your keyboard. Begin speaking or playing your audio source.

Click the Stop button (square icon) or press spacebar when finished.

#### **Importing Audio Files**

To work with existing audio files:
Go to File > Import > Audio.
Select the audio file you want to import.
The file will appear as a new track in your project.

#### **Basic Editing**

#### **Selection Tool**

The Selection Tool (I-beam icon) is your primary editing tool: Click and drag to select portions of audio. Double-click a track to select the entire track. Use Shift+Click to extend or shorten your selection.

### **Cut, Copy, and Paste**

To remove audio:

Select the desired portion and press Ctrl+X or click Edit > Cut.

To copy audio:

Select the portion and press Ctrl+C or click Edit > Copy

To paste audio:

Position the cursor where you want to insert and press Ctrl+V or click Edit > Paste.

## **Deleting Audio**

Select the unwanted audio and press the Delete key.

## **Working with Multiple Tracks**

Audacity allows you to work with multiple audio tracks simultaneously:

Adding a new track:

Go to Tracks > Add New > Mono/Stereo Track.

Aligning tracks:

Use the Time Shift Tool (double-headed arrow) to move tracks horizontally.

Adjusting volume:

Use the gain slider in the Track Control Panel to adjust individual track volumes.

### **Applying Effects**

Audacity offers a wide range of audio effects:

Select the audio you want to modify.

Go to the Effect menu and choose the desired effect.

Adjust the effect parameters in the dialog box that appears.

Click "Preview" to hear the result before applying.

Click "Apply" to finalize the effect.

Some commonly used effects include:

Noise Reduction: Removes background noise from recordings.

Normalize: Adjusts the overall volume of a track.

Equalization: Modifies the frequency balance of the audio. Compression: Reduces the dynamic range of the audio.

### **Exporting Your Project**

When you're ready to save your work as an audio file:

Go to File > Export > Export as MP3/WAV/OGG (choose your preferred format).

Select a destination and file name.

Adjust export settings if needed (e.g., bit rate for MP3 such as for cd quality for music is 128 and for voice quality is 64).

Click "Save" to export your file.

#### **Advanced Features**

## **Envelope Tool**

The Envelope Tool allows for precise volume control over specific sections of audio:

Select the Envelope Tool (line with points icon).

Click on the audio track to create control points.

Drag these points up or down to adjust volume.

## **Generating Audio**

Audacity can generate various types of audio:

Go to Generate menu.

Choose from options like Silence, Noise, or Tone.

Set the parameters and duration.

Click "OK" to insert the generated audio at the cursor position.

## **Keyboard Shortcuts**

Learning keyboard shortcuts can significantly speed up your workflow.

Some essential shortcuts include:

Spacebar: Play/Pause

Ctrl+Z: Undo Ctrl+Y: Redo Ctrl+1: Zoom In Ctrl+3: Zoom Out

Shift+M: Mute/Unmute selected track

#### **Tips for Better Recordings**

Use a pop filter:

This reduces explosive sounds (p, b, t) when recording vocals. Monitor your levels: Avoid clipping by keeping your input levels below 0 dB. Record in a quiet environment: Minimize background noise for cleaner recordings.

Use headphones:

This prevents audio feedback when recording with a microphone.

#### **Saving Your Project**

Remember to regularly save your project: Go to File > Save Project. Choose a location and name for your project file. Click "Save".

This creates an Audacity project file (.aup3) that preserves all your tracks and edits.

Audacity caters to both beginners and advanced users. As you become more familiar with its features, you'll discover numerous ways to enhance your audio projects. Remember to explore the software's extensive documentation and community forums for more in-depth information and troubleshooting. With practice, you'll be able to record, edit, and produce high-quality audio projects. Whether you're creating podcasts, music, or voice-overs, Audacity provides the tools you need to bring your audio projects to life.

Apps You Run on Your Computer Are ".exe" files

Your device (Windows or Apple computer, iPhone, iPad, or whatever) runs "apps," which is a term short for "applications". An app is a program or a set of

instructions for the computer to execute or "run." They are why you have your device. Although apps can run on any device, to keep it simple, let's look at how an "app" runs on a Windows computer (almost the same on any device).

When you purchase your device (Windows computer), it comes with many apps that have already been installed and are ready to go. Some very helpful apps with Windows are WordPad, Paint, Calculator, and many others, such as some games, utility apps, and more. You are probably unaware of all the apps that come with Windows that have already been installed. If you want an app you do not have, like a game, Microsoft Word, or Firefox, you must DOWNLOAD and INSTALL it on your device. You are downloading and installing an EXECUTABLE computer file; that is, it can "run" on your device. This file type has a name that ends with ".exe," meaning "executable."

You are probably already aware of a "file" on your Windows computer. A file can be a text document, a photo, or a spreadsheet. If you wanted to create or write a new app from scratch, you would write the app using computer language and write it in a file, too. But what you are doing by writing an app is you are giving commands or instructions for the computer to follow. Suppose you were writing a game app to play tic-tac-toe on your computer; you would have to write instructions for the computer to recognize where each X or O is on the grid and where to place the next move. So this app is written as a file just like any other file except the name of this kind of file ends with ".exe." If you have downloaded (that is, copied a file from somewhere else, like a website, for example), you probably have noticed that the name of the file you downloaded ends with ".exe." In Windows, one way to run such a file is to click your mouse on the file name – your computer sees it as an executable file and runs it.

It is the same if you double-click an app icon on your desktop; you tell the computer to run that app.

Maybe you get notices that there is an update to an app you already have. If you download the update, it is an executable file (a ".exe" file) that you click on to run the update.

Exe files are not for you to open and look at or change. They are in computer or machine" language that you would not be able to understand. But they ARE just files stored on your computer in a program or apps folder. To remove an app from your device, you must UNINSTALL it using a Windows or other utility app to do that. Please do NOT attempt to find the executable file yourself and delete it.

If you want to learn more about executable files or apps, ask Google and watch a short video or two about it. But most of us want the app to run so we can use our device how we want.
